concerned, I share her opposition, but Professor Asper is right, besically the first two clauses, the first sentence and the first clause of the second sentence are basically what is in the First Amendment of the Constitution, No law shall be enacted establishing religion -- well, they don't change it much, shall be restricted in the free exercise of religious profession and worship. If you just have an establishment clause, you still have the problem of interference with free exercise. Suppose Maryland like West Virginia, passed a law requiring all students to salute the flag and Joe Hoffa's witnesses don't like to salute the flag and went to the Supreme Court of the United States twice and suppose it came up under the State Constitution, and that would be a restriction in my view on the free exercise of their religion.
