l clause doesn't go to my motion.

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Mr. Chairman, after having heard the discussion, I would certainly be amenable to an amendment, and I would like to amend my motion so that the language would be as follows; attempting as I am to preserve as much of the venerable language as is possible consistent with the modern concepts of law in this area.

I would suggest two sentences in place of the clause, which would be as follows: Every man shall have the right to worship or not to worship in any manner that he thinks most acceptable. All persons shall be equally entitled to protection of their religious liberties, semicolon, wherefore no person shall by any law be molested in his person or estate, et cetera, as it goes down to the end of the language.

THE CHAIRMAN: Would you give us the first sentence again?

MR. CASE: Every man shall have the right to worship or not to worship in any manner that he thinks most acceptable. That will take out the, him, if that is a stumbling block, but I think that that language would
