at least preserve the words that have come down as 1 2 meaningful words since 1776. THE CHAIRMAN: You purposely omitted the word, 3 4 God, in the first sentence? 5 MR: CASE: Yes. THE CHAIRMAN: All right, you ready for the 6 7 Mr. Gentry? question? MR. GENTRY: Unless under the color. You 8 9 don't run into that. 10 MR. CASE: No. DR. BARD: May I ask Mr. Case a question? Why 11 do you object to going down to rights, such as Mr. Clagett 12 13 suggested? I think it is another thought here. 14 MR. CASE: that is the reason. It deals with the different concept. 15 I think that concept ought to be debated separately and 16 apart from what we are talking about here. What I am 17 again trying to do is only preserve the language. 18 It seems to me you are somewhat 19 DR. BARD: contradictory because this is within the language. 20 21 MR.
