

1 MR. SAYRE: I probably realize there was no
2 legal problem in interpreting that.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any further question
4 about Section 3? Mr. Bond?

5 MR. BOND: I renew my motion made as a result
6 of a comment from Mr. Clagett that we pick up the rest of
7 the language in old Article 36, beginning with the word,
8 unless, and ending with the word, rights, and the reason
9 for that is that --

10 THE CHAIRMAN: I think the motion ought to be
11 more definite for the record than that. You better read
12 it.

13 MR. BOND: That the words, unless under the
14 color of religion he shall disturb the good order, peace
15 or safety of the State or shall infringe the laws -- I will
16 strike that, the State or injure others in their natural
17 civil or religious rights.

18 MR. CLAGETT: Let it read consistent with the
19 amendment we just voted upon, and no man -- let it read,
20 No man under the color of religion shall disturb the good
21 order, peace or safety of the State or shall infringe.
