MR. BOND: That the words, unless under the color of religion he shall disturb the good order, peace or safety of the State or shall infringe the laws -- I will strike that, the State or injure others in their natural civil or religious rights.

MR. CLAGETT: Let it read consistent with the amendment we just voted upon, and no man -- let it read,

No man under the color of religion shall disturb the good order, peace or safety of the State or shall infringe.
