

1 Quakers where a meeting was held to be against the peace
2 and good order and safety of England where all they were
3 going to do was meet. In more recent times, Quaker meet-
4 ings support their members who choose to go to prison
5 rather than obey the draft laws. Again, you might be tak-
6 ing action against the good order of the State depending
7 on how you ask.

8 MR. SCANLAN: As part of the expression, I want
9 to say Amen.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Jenkins?

11 DR. JENKINS: I want to say Amen twice. These
12 limitations provide the crack for withdrawal of religious
13 liberty. As you say, you may have a Baptist preacher
14 who preaches above the normal level and say, Well, you are
15 disturbing the peace. I really prefer, I am sorry it is
16 lost, the original statement of the Committee, but I don't
17 think we should insert this further prohibition. We should
18 leave this to the courts in each individual instance where
19 someone alleges a violation.
