Quakers where a meeting was held to be against the peace
and good order and safety of England where all they were
going to do was meet. In more recent times, Quaker meetings support their members who choose to go to prison
rather than obey the draft laws. Again, you might be taking action against the good order of the State depending

on how you ask.  $\mbox{MR. SCANLAN: As part of the expression, I want}$  to say  $\mbox{Amen.}$

DR. JENKINS: I want to say Amen twice. These limitations provide the crack for withdrawal of religious liberty. As you say, you may have a Baptist preacher who preaches above the normal level and say, Well, you are disturbing the peace. I really prefer, I am sorry it is lost, the original statement of the Committee, but I don't think we should insert this further prohibition. We should leave this to the courts in each individual instance where someone alleges a violation.
