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MRS. BOTHE: Is it then necessary to keep the first sentence in?

MR. CASE: Certainly. Then, Mr. Chairman, the last clause of the second sentence should start off, No person shall be --

THE CHAIRMAN: This is picked up after your last motion. Any further discussion? If not, we will suspend on consideration of the Declaration and resume with Section 4 tomorrow and proceed with discussion of the Fifth Report of the Committee on Legislative Department.

Dr. Bard?

DR. BARD: Okay. As far as Section 1 is concerned, I suspect there won't be any discussion on that, and the same would apply in reference to Section 2. This is the Fifth Report, dated August 5, 1966.

THE CHAIRMAN: Fifth Report of the Committee on Legislative Department.

DR. BARD: You may have two. I don't think there will be any question, Mr. Chairman, concerning Sections 1 or 2. These are perfunctory things in the main. As for Section 3, it is now worded in conformance with
