

1 DR. BARD: Ratio of number of senators in
2 each senatorial district with the population of such dis-
3 trict shall be such that the largest ratio shall not
4 exceed the smallest by more than 10 per cent.

5 The ratio of the number of delegates in each
6 House district for the population of such district shall be
7 such that the largest ratio shall not exceed the smallest
8 by more than 10 per cent.

9 DR. BURDETTE: I think it is most unfortunate
10 that we don't have the language, but it does appear in
11 the Fourth Report.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

13 DR. BARD: Page 3 of the Fourth Report.

14 DR. BURDETTE: I did want to emphasize what I
15 got from your comment, that this would mean that when you
16 get an average size district that you really wouldn't
17 have a deviation upwards or downwards by more than 5 per
18 cent.

19 DR. BARD: Right.

20 DR. BURDETTE: I don't recall the percentages
21 approved by the Court of Appeals in the present one, but
