4 line on Page 4 be, a plan of legislative proportionment
5 or redistricting?

6 DR. BARD: Right; reapportionment.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: What other changes would you
8 make?

9 MR. SAYRE: And legislative.

10 DR. BARD: Legislative. Well, you would have to
11 say, reapportion and redistrict.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Your second sentence, Dr. Bard.

13 DR. BARD: I want to think this over for a
14 minute. The General Assembly shall redistrict the State.
15 That is all right. You don't reapportion the State.
16 You could say, and reapportion the Legislature. I guess
17 you could say that.

18 MR. SAYRE: This Article deals only with the
19 General Assembly in any event.
