

1 at Easton did not give the Legislature the authority
2 we felt it should have. We still believe it should be,
3 continuing body.

4 MR. BOND: I would like to point out to Dr.
5 Bard that he is not being too persistent because you
6 have a partial victory at Easton. Instead of having the
7 normal 70-day session, the Commission as a compromise,
8 gave you an extra 30 days if the Legislature feels they
9 have to stay in session. Again, I don't think this
10 should be continually debated at length by us. We have
11 the problems of the effective date of legislation. We
12 have the problems of dispatch of business. We have con-
13 tinuing legislative bodies that are not doing the jobs
14 as they should, and we have the recommendations of our
15 own legislative leaders that there should be a deadline
16 on such.

17 MR. MILLER: We certainly don't want to prolong
18 this, but I do think the Commission should bear one thing
19 in mind, and that is the only point, that I would like this
20 to be reconsidered, and that is that our concept of
21 government is three distinct bodies of equal powers and
