2 Now the courts can meet whenever they want.
3 The Executive Department is constantly in session, and
4 it seems to me that to maintain the Legislature, the
5 Legislative branch and the dignity it is entitled to,
6 there ought to be some loophole whereby if they have
7 served 100 days, they don't go home and they are out of
8 business unless the Governor chooses to call them.
9 Now, it is not with the idea of prolonging their duties,
10 but it seems to me we are making them second class citi-
11 zens as compared with the Executive and Judicial branches.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett?

13 MR. CLAGETT: I would like to state I voted
14 against the continuing body as contained in the Fourth
15 Report, but I have since had other thoughts. If the
16 Legislature is going to be dealing with greater and
17 greater general purpose problems and they are going to
18 increase in complexity as time goes on, we should not put
19 the pressure upon them to solve those problems but leave
20 it to their own discretion; and if they need the addition-
21 al time to work out a problem to come to a proper solution,
