8 Easton, and I think the comment makes clear what was  
9 discussed at Easton.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Any question on Section 8?  
11 Section 9.

12 DR. BARD: The same. We did word this in  
13 affirmative language after the recommendation was so made.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Any question? Section 10.

15 DR. BARD: Section 10 takes care of a matter  
16 of an election, next regular biennial election, for any  
17 time for remaining portions of the unexpired term. This  
18 is a significant change in the Constitution. This is  
19 formulated at the Easton meeting.

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Any question? Dr. Michener?
