

1 DR. BARD: Wouldn't he need to file in the
2 primary as well as the general?

3 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, that still wouldn't
4 affect this sentence. You wouldn't have the term end at
5 the primary. This would still be general.

6 MR. SCANLAN: We use the word, biennial, to
7 insure the special election to be held at the time of
8 the conventional elections.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: But it would be the general
10 election and not the primary.

11 JUDGE ADKINS: Was that matter debated at
12 Easton, having a member of the Legislature elected?

13 THE CHAIRMAN: Discussed at length.

14 MR. SCANLAN: I remember Dick Case was opposed
15 to it. You thought it would be unnecessary expense.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion of the
17 question as to Section 10? Go ahead.

18 DR. BARD: Section 11.—No senator or delegate,
19 after qualifying as such, notwithstanding he may there-
20 after resign. shall during the whole period of time for
21 which he was elected be eligible to any office which
