

1 to Mr. Bond's question, 29 States have similar provisions.
2 The majority of them use, not to be appointed. A number
3 of them, I would say, about ten, say not to be appointed
4 or elected. A few of them, actually only the Maryland
5 one states, eligible, use the word, eligible.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment?

7 JUDGE ADKINS: This would eliminate any mem-
8 ber of the Legislature from running for governor if the
9 salary of governor were increased during the period of
10 time he were in the Legislature.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Correct. Any further question or
12 discussion? Dr. Jenkins?

13 DR. JENKINS: I think the problem that we might
14 face here would be in the appointing of a person rather
15 than increasing the salary and ask the Committee if they
16 would accept an amendment deleting emoluments or salary
17 or profits. You think that would weaken it too much.
18 I can foresee many problems arising if this is retained.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: I think Dr. Jenkins' suggestion
20 is two-fold if I followed him. One is to change the
