THE CHAIRMAN: A particular seat rather than a particular person.

MR. CASE: That is right.

MR. HOFF: Judge Adkins, in this case you assume you are going to have a completely new one half Legislature, one half House, every two years. That isn't true. There is only about what, Governor Lane, 30 per cent turnover as an average in each election?

GOVERNOR LANE: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: The estimate of the Legislative group as I remember it was about 50 per cent. Do you recall, Dr. Bard?

DR. BARD:: Closer to 30 from all figures I have.

MR. HOFF: Really when you consider, let's say 30, say 50 per cent change, it means you are only changing 25 per cent of the membership of the House in any election, which doesn't seem to be a drastic change.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Winslow?

DR. WINSLOW: The comment I had to make was the one Congressman Miller made about fewer elections.
