

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

2 MR. MILLER: Mr. Chairman, I perhaps am going
3 to vote for Dr. Jenkins' thoughts on it, because I am in
4 full sympathy with highlighting this. Personally, I am
5 a member, I am really a minority group member. I have
6 been a lifelong Quaker, and I don't think there are over
7 200,000 of us in the entire United States.

8 DR. JENKINS: I thought you were going to say
9 Republican.

10 MR. MILLER: That is a minority group, but a
11 little bigger. The thought occurs to me that in answer-
12 ing some of the questions about its legal effect, I can
13 see an incident, a possible incident, where two employees
14 of the Government are discharged for alleged incompetence
15 and if one of them is a member of a minority group,
16 either religious, race, color, whatnot, if we have any-
17 thing like that, that particular individual would have
18 more teeth in a claim that he was being discriminated
19 than a white Protestant, for instance, and I don't
20 believe we are adding to the thing. However, if it will
