

1 social climate by being somewhat more specific than the  
2 general language which you propose. What I am trying  
3 to say is that the Committee's language is basically  
4 the language of the Constitution of the United States,  
5 and yet discrimination did exist for 150 years under  
6 that very broad language, so it doesn't seem to me that  
7 the argument that the breadth of the language is all-  
8 encompassing is necessarily an answer to Dr. Jenkins'  
9 question. For that reason, while I think a lot of  
10 arguments, logical arguments, semantic arguments can be  
11 made by the inclusion of specifics in relation to the  
12 general, I think that he is quite right in insisting  
13 that some reference to this problem be made in this docu-  
14 ment..

15 DR. BURDETTE: Couldn't we have the language of  
16 Dr. Jenkins again? As I heard it --

17 THE CHAIRMAN: Which, the motion or his last  
18 suggestion?

19 DR. BURDETTE: The last one. I would like to  
20 write it down if I could. As I got it orally, I thought  
21 the last clause of it was redundant.
