

1 MR. GENTRY: Question.

2 THE CHAIRMAN: The question arises on the
3 motion to add the following sentence between the present
4 two sentences of Section 4: No person shall by law be
5 discriminated against because of religion, race, color,
6 ancestry or national origin.

7 Those in favor, signify by a show of hands.
8 Opposed. The motion is carried, 8 to 6.

9 MR. SCANLAN: Very frankly, I found that the
10 most difficult vote I have cast at this Commission.
11 My head was with you, Mr. Eney, in your arguments, but
12 my heart was with Dr. Jenkins, and I followed St. Paul's
13 admonition that the lecturer killeth, but the spirit giveth
14 life.

15 MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, I would like my
16 vote against that recorded, please.
