2 but just a statement of principle, and it goes on, And
3 all general warrants to search and inspect places or
4 to apprehend suspected persons without naming or describ-
5 ing the places or the person are illegal and not to be
6 granted. We feel that this is an area whereby adopting
7 the Federal language we pick up all the body of law
8 which has grown up around the United States Fourth
9 Amendment and have its benefits of its interpretation by
10 the Supreme Court over the years.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Any question? Mrs. Bothe?

12 MRS. BOTHE: Before I raise the one I raised
13 before, on this added phrase, to have the assistance of
14 counsel, instead of merely the right to counsel --

15 PROFESSOR ASPER: That is not here.

16 MRS. BOTHE: I am always ahead. I will raise
17 the wiretapping question at this point.
