

1 DR. JENKINS: I think the rump session should
2 share its conclusions with us.

3 MRS. BOTHE: We were all being very agreeable
4 then.

5 MR. GENTRY: It was considered by the Com-
6 mittee. It was felt that the general law on search and
7 seizures was sufficient for purposes intended by the
8 wiretapping prohibition, and we felt that presently we
9 now have wiretap restrictions, both Federal and State, and
10 we feel that there is no likelihood of any diminution
11 of those statutory limitations, and we just felt it was
12 not a subject which warranted treatment in the Consti-
13 tution.

16 The right of the people to be secure against intercep-
17 tion of telephone, telegraph and other electronic means
18 of communication and against interception of oral and
