2 MR. SAYRE: The right of the people to be
3 secure against interception of telephone, telegraph and
4 other electronic means of communication and against in-
5 terception of oral and other communications by electric
6 or electronic means shall not be violated. Then, the
7 additional sentence, Evidence obtained in violation of
8 this Section shall not be admissible in any court against
9 any person.

10 MR. BOND: May I ask Mr. Sayre why he omitted
11 the word, unreasonable, before the word, interception?
12 The New York Constitution has the word, unreasonable,
13 and the model has, unreasonable, in it. Why did you
14 exclude it?

15 MR. SAYRE: The model had a great deal of
16 difficulty and the model is a compromise of a compromise,
17 and when you take the real middle ground, leaving out,
18 reasonable, does permit, and I am saying you should not
19 permit this at all and if you want to go to the other
20 extreme, this would be a crime; so this is really a compro-
21 mise as to protection of privacy.
