

1 unreasonable searches, seizures and interceptions,
2 shall not be violated, and no warrant shall issue but
3 probable cause supported by oath or affirmation, et
4 cetera.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you accept the amendment,
6 Mr. Sayre?

7 MR. SAYRE: Perhaps, oral, would be restrictive.
8 What do you think, Judge?

9 MR. MILLER: Would not that --

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Wait just a second. I want
11 to find out if he accepts it.

12 MR. SAYRE: I am getting back to the problem
13 where probable cause is so hard to obtain.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Don't debate it. Do you accept
15 the amendment so we know what we are debating? If not,
16 the discussion will go back to our motion.

17 MR. SAYRE: Well, all right, I will compromise.
18 Is, oral, desirable here, or would you say, communications?

19 JUDGE ADKINS: I prefer the word, oral, because
20 I think everything else is covered -- all written docu-
21 ments are covered in papers and effects.
