3 tions between people completely unrelated. I make the
4 point only to suggest to you that your motion be modified,
5 instead of using that precise language at the end, to
6 refer the precise language to the Committee.

7 JUDGE ADKINS: That is perfectly acceptable.
8 to me. All I wanted to get across was the idea that I
9 think the concept of adding, oral communications, to
10 persons, houses papers and effects, is a broadening of
11 the search and seizure provisions to meet the modern
12 scene. The language that is involved, I don't care, I
13 agree with.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Could we say your motion would
15 be, and assuming Mr. Sayre accepts it, to refer this Sec-
16 tion back to the Committee with the instructions to amend
17 it so as to include in the things prohibited against
18 oral communications, interception of oral communications?

19 JUDGE ADKINS: Perfectly agreeable to me.

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Is that agreeable to you, Mr.
21 Sayre, Mrs. Bothe?
