

1 MR. SAYRE: Yes.

2 MR. MILLER: Subject to a warrant being ob-
3 tained that they could be intercepted?

4 THE CHAIRMAN: That is correct. Is there
5 further discussion? Are you ready for the question?
6 The question arises on the motion to refer Section 6
7 back to the Committee, with instructions to modify it
8 so as to include in the prohibition against unreasonable
9 searches and seizures the interception of oral communica-
10 tions and to provide that by appropriate language for
11 the interception of such oral communications on warrant
12 or on probable cause. Are you ready for the question?
13 All in favor, signify by saying Aye; contrary, No. We
14 will take a show of hands. All in favor, signify by
15 a show of hands. Contrary. The motion carries, 15 to 2.

16 Is there any further discussion of Section 6?

17 I would like to ask the Committee this one
18 question. It seems to me even though the language is
19 traditional, that it is perhaps not grammatical, and I
20 wonder also whether in this context the use of the word,
21 warrants, is clearly referring only to search warrants.
