

1 In the Maryland Constitution, of course, you don't have
2 the doubt, because it is, Warrants to search, or, Warrants
3 to seize, I have forgotten exactly which. Did the Com-
4 mittee by any chance, consider this?

5 PROFESSOR ASPER: I didn't think there was
6 any problem. I thought that the warrant provision
7 refers, of course, to the introductory phrase, which
8 says, The right of people to be secure in their persons,
9 houses, papers and effects.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Without discussing it further,
11 since the Section comes back to the Committee, would you
12 consider that and also the grammar involved in the
13 phrase, Warrant shall issue but probable cause, and
14 particularly describing the place, et cetera.
