suggestion made by Mr. Miller, that the Committee was considering, to eliminate the words, against him. Perhaps not.

JUDGE ADKINS: I would suggest, Mr. Chairman, that there have been two or three matters here that have been discussed. Maybe the Committee might want to reconsider some of this language.

THE CHAIRMAN: I think that might be desirable.

You made two suggestions, Mr. Clagett made a suggestion involving changes in language, and perhaps the desirable thing is to refer the Section back to the Committee to consider these several suggestions.

PROFESSOR ASPER: I would like a little more guidance if that is going to be the position, because we have talked about whether, A person accused of crime,

is too narrow, whether we should include juveniles,

THE CHAIRMAN: Let's get at it by a series of votes to take the sense of the meeting on specific matters without trying to agree on the precise language.
