3 me that what ought to be done, if you leave it the way  
4 it is, you ought to discuss in the comments what you  
5 mean by that, and that you are not intending, if you  
6 aren't, to apply it to traffic cases.

7 PROFESSOR ASPER: First of all, do you want  
8 to change it?

9 MR. MARTINEAU: I don't know that we want to  
10 change the constitutional phrase. I think we want to  
11 have some idea of what is implied by the phrase, Any  
12 person accused of crime.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment or discus-  
14 sion with respect to Section 7? If not, Section 8.

15 MR. GENTRY: Section 8. No person shall be  
16 subject for the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy  
17 of punishment or be compelled in any criminal case  
18 to be a witness against himself.
