1 what the Committee wants in the Section.

MR. MARTINEAU: That is right. It seems to me that what ought to be done, if you leave it the way it is, you ought to discuss in the comments what you mean by that, and that you are not intending, if you aren't, to apply it to traffic cases.

PROFESSOR ASPER: First of all, do you want to change it?

MR. MARTINEAU: I don't know that we want to change the constitutional phrase. I think we want to have some idea of what is implied by the phrase, Any person accused of crime.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment or discussion with respect to Section 7? If not, Section 8.

MR. GENTRY: Section 8. No person shall be subject for the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy of punishment or be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself.

This is somewhat Pennsylvania Dutch, but that is United States language. The Article 22 which this follows reads, No man ought to be compelled to give
