

1 MR. CLAGETT: Not a conviction; you mean  
2 acquittal.

3 MR. SCANLAN: Acquittal, I am sorry.

4 MRS. BOTHE: I think the comment of the Com-  
5 mittee ought to reflect this so the Convention is aware  
6 of the effect of this change if it is made.

7 PROFESSOR ASPER: I make the same observation  
8 we had before. We are trying to get it together so you  
9 can see the language. This is the First Report.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further questions?

11 MR. HAILE: I would like to ask whether this  
12 is put in jeopardy; criminal punishment in the court  
13 of law, is that what we intend? A person may be dismissed  
14 from public office for the same ground on which a criminal  
15 court has acquitted him. This says, In jeopardy of  
16 punishment in a broad sense. I wonder if that should be  
17 limited to, Criminal punishment or punishment in a court  
18 of law.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Any comment?

20 PROFESSOR ASPER: I can't see any interpreta-  
21 tion by which punishment would include being removed
