Not a conviction; you mean

2 acquittal. MR. SCANLAN: Acquittal, I am sorry. 3 MR\$. BOTHE: I think the comment of the Committee ought to reflect this so the Convention is aware 5 of the effect of this change if it is made. PROFESSOR ASPER: I make the same observation 70 we had before. We are trying to get it together so you 8 can see the language. This is the First Report. 9 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further questions? 10 MR. HAILE: I would like to ask whether this 11 is put in jeopardy; criminal punishment in the court 12 of law, is that what we intend? A person may be dismissed 13 from public office for the same ground on which a criminal 14 court has acquitted him. This says, In jeopardy of 15 pundshment in a broad sense. I wonder if that should be 16 limited to, Criminal punishment or punishment in a court 17 18 of law. THE CHAIRMAN: Any comment? 19 PROFESSOR ASPER: I can't see any interpreta-20 tion by which punishment would include being removed 21
