2 MR. MARTINEAU: What about the loss of pension
3 rights? I think there is one case in Baltimore County
4 going on right now.

5 PROFESSOR ASPER: He calls that punishment.

6 MR. MARTINEAU: Isn't what you really mean here,
7 conviction?

8 MR. HAILE: Yes, why not say it?

9 MR. SAYRE: How about, offense?

10 MR. GENTRY: Again, this is the reason why we
11 felt, I particularly felt, by use of Federal language,
12 which has been given a clear meaning by the courts over
13 a period, a longer period of years, we pick up without
14 spelling out this detail, that detail, omitting some,
15 going too far in some other areas. We state the principle
16 here. It has been interpreted over the years.

17 MR. HAILE: Doesn't the Federal law say, In
18 jeopardy of life?

19 MR. GENTRY: Yes.

20 MR. SCANLAN: I would have no objection if
21 they followed the Federal language, but if you don't, you
