1 are presented with the problem to which Mr. Martineau 2 refers. A city official is convicted of a crime, then he is acquitted of a crime, and he is still kicked out 3 4 of his job. 5 THE CHAIRMAN: Or a lawyer is convicted and is 6 disbarred. 7 PROFESSOR ASPER: Is that punishment? 8 THE CHAIRMAN: Suspension may be considered 9 In other words, theoretically you could say as such. 10 disbarment is simply to protect the public, but suspension 11 is certainly punishment. 12 MRS. BOTHE: I move the Federal language be 13 substituted for the language proposed. 14 THE CHAIRMAN: Let's get in the record the 15 precise language you are suggesting. 16 MRS, BOTHE: That in lieu of the present 17 language of Section 8, that it be reworded to read, the 18 first section of this, No person shall be subject for 19 the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy of life or 20 limb, and then to go on, Or be compelled in any criminal 21 case.
