

1 MR. SCANLAN: Would you accept Mr. Gentry's
2 suggestion that the word, criminal, be added before the
3 word, punishment? That would embrace all forms of
4 criminal punishment, but would not embrace loss of
5 pension rights, disbarment, loss of employment, and it
6 would be a little simpler and better language, because,
7 life and limb, doesn't include imprisonment. No one is
8 taking your life away and the warden is not going to
9 saw your leg off, but, criminal punishment seems to
10 me to embrace everything we want and yet avoid Mr. Mar-
11 tineau's cases.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you accept the amendment,
13 Mrs. Bothe?

14 MRS. BOTHE: I have been thinking about it
15 because I think the conflict in my mind, I agree with
16 Mr. Scanlan, that that word would serve the purpose. It
17 is a question of whether we are going to use the Federal
18 language where possible. The Committee has announced
19 it as a principle and yet here, for some reason, they
20 reject it.
