that imprisonment of any duration is not cruel and un-1 2 usual. MR. MARTINEAU: As long as it is within the 3 bounds set by the Legislature, that is right. 4 THE CHAIRMAN: That doesn't mean that this 5 sentence would be meaningless, though. 6 MR. MILLER: Would you not agree --7 MR. MARTINEAU: It is under our current cir-8 cumstances where we don't have corporal punishment 9 10 provided by law. MR. MILLER: Is it not agreed that a judge 11 could strike down an excessive sentence, regardless of 12 what the Legislature said, that if it was cruel and un-13 usual in his opinion, that it wouldn't be constitutional? 14 MR. MARTINEAU: The Court of Appeals held 15 as long as it is within the limits set by the Legislature, 16 it is not cruel and unusual, no matter how ridiculous 17 the sentence might be. It might be accumulative terms 18 adding up to 2000 terms for stealing some tobacco. 19 MR. MILLER: Cigarettes. 20

MR. MARTINEAU: Yes, if you steal a carton
