Professor Burdette? THE CHAIRMAN:

DR. BURDETTE: This interpretation Mr. Martineau brings forward is supported in Article 25 of the Declaration of Rights currently, which winds up by saying, all these things shall not be done by the courts

of law.

Now, Professor Asper has suggested that by implication, that by leaving out the courts of law, the Committee has intended to include the Legislature. I raised the question as to whether or not by simply

omitting the language courts would later interpret that our language has been simplified and it really means the same thing that the original Constitution had, and

that we would be better off to put in a reference to the Legislature and court.

MR. MARTINEAU: They use the term, inflicted, and only the court would inflict the punishment.

THE CHAIRMAN: I think that is much too restrictive use of the term.
