wouldn't be loaded down with a lot of provisions, that there would be legislation necessary to recommend that would not be in the permanent body of the constitution but that would be a carry-over for the period until the new constitution was being worked. This would be one thing the Legislature would start off for its first term on X dollars.

THE CHAIRMAN: This is true. There are many such things. One of the provisions which we are going to have to draft which is the function of the Committee on Style is to provide some catch-all general clause in the constitution that would save legislation for an interim period. You could do that here by providing that the Legislature should continue to receive the same salary until the next session. Why is it necessary to have the convention debate and decide a question of salaries.

MR. MILLER: I agree it is not necessary

for the convention to do it but I think the convention

has to have some means to carry over between the adoption

of the constitution and its effectiveness to take up the
