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legislative void. I think the only reason we wouldn't have recommended that the salary remain the same is that I think it was a general feeling among the members of the subcommittee that present salaries are inadequate and we didn't want to freeze it.

MR. MARTINEAU: Mr. Chairman, I think the problem is that first of all the nature of the Legislature is probably going to be quite different so that present salary whether inadequate or not isn't going to be adequate for a new Legislature.

Tied to that is the idea you don't want a legislative body voting on its own salary. Somewhere you have to adopt a salary for the next Legislature. It seems to me the constitutional convention is really the only body that can do that. The only thing I am objecting to here is you say they should do this by legislation or something. I think if they are going to do it and you don't want it as a permanent part of the constitution, you would either adopt it as a schedule as part of the constitution or as a clause of the constitution which would automatically drop out after four years.
