assignments within the next four or five days. I have heretofore advised the Commission of the resignation of Mr. Alexander Harvey as Reporter for the Committee on Legislative Department and the appointment of Dr. John H. Michener in his place. I think we are very fortunate to have Dr. Michener to be able to and willing to assume the duties of reporter to this Committee. He has, as you know, been working very closely with the Committee, and the transition from Mr. Harvey to Dr. Michener can be accomplished without the slightest hitch in the work of that Committee. We do not as yet have complete figures on the results of the voting in the Constitutional Conven-

The latest figures I have are approximately 125,000 for, and 24,000 plus against. As soon as we have the final official figures, we will send them to you. I think it would interest you to know, however, that although the total amount of the votes cast, somewhere roughly 150,000, is not as large as some of us had hoped for.
