total votes cast for election. I am not sure of the total, but I think it was a little less than 300,000, and the proportion of votes cast in the Constitutional Referendum to the total votes cast for the nominees for governor is, I think, higher than it has ever been ona Constitutional Convention Referendum in the present century, at least, 1930-1950.

More interestingly, I think, is the fact that in some counties, I know for instance in Talbot County on the Eastern Shore, the percentage of persons voting on the Constitutional Convention Referendum was approximately 50 per cent of the total number of persons casting ballots in that election. Whether Congressman Miller had anything to do with that, I don't know, but I was very pleasantly surprised, and the same thing is true in some of the other counties. We found on election morning that there were a great many complaints made, many directly to our office; by llo'clock I think we had 25 or 30 telephone calls, and several of the radio stations told us they had been deluged with calls, people at first insisting that the question was not on the voting machine.
