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DR. BARD: We would certainly accept that amendment. Am I not speaking correctly for the Committee? That's exactly what we had in mind.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: I don't see the reason for one and two. Two seems to be a specific elaboration of one and more appropriate for us to act on because we talk to salaries, we talk to the salary of the first Legislature. We talk to prescribing this by law. What is the point of number one when number two says what we want it to say it seems to me.

DR. BARD: That is correct, Mrs. Freedlander, except to take care of this single occurrence.

two except other than members of the first Legislature elected after adoption, you say all the things you say in one except you say it more specifically and, I think, more appropriately in number two.
