coverage. The problem here, of course, was to get lists of addresses and actually get the mailing accomplished. We had a great deal of help in a number of ways. One of the large insurance companies made available its list of some 40,000 policyholders in the State of Maryland, durnished us with address slips. We were able to get the City of Baltimore to give us address slips on the entire -- list of employees of the City, some 30,000, and similar arrangements with other groups so that the pamphlets had a wide coverage.

The problem with the pamphlets was that the mailing was not first class mailing, and the actual delivery of some of them was a little too close to the election. The Citizens Committee is preparing a report of its activities at our request because we think this will be valuable in undertacing a campaign to educate the public as to the importance of voting next spring on the election for delegates to the Convention.
