sidered. This means that the October meeting will be indeed a very important meeting, and I am afraid it will be a lengthy meeting. I will take up with you before the end of the session on Tuesday what we should do in October; depending on what progress we make at this meeting, I think it is clear that we will have to have more than a two-day meeting, and there may be a question as to whether it will be better to have a three-day meeting such as we are having this time, or to have two weekend meetings a week apart. You might be giving some thought to that in the next day or so.

I am sure all of you received the notice indicating that, through the courtesy of the Governor, we will be his guests on the State yacht tomorrow evening. We will adjourn the usual time tomorrow afternoon about 5:15, leave here about 5:30 and go aboard the yacht about 6 o'clock. We will have dinner aboard and return to Annapolis around 9:15 or 9:30 and drive back to College Park so that you will be back in ample time.

I think our experience at the last meeting, when one reads the transcript, at least indicated that a
