1 proposed when two-thirds of both Houses were present. 2 DR. BARD: Congress, whenever two-thirds of 3 both Houses, not those present. 4 DR, WINSLOW: That has been interpreted, sir, I 5 think as two-thirds of those present. I know of no case 6 in which there is two-thirds of all the Members required 7 of the National Assembly. 8 MR. CLAGETT: What would be the arithmetic. 9 what would be two-thirds of the House and Senate? 10 THE CHAIRMAN: You mean as of the next session? 11 MR. CLACETT: Yes, sir. 12 DR. BARD: Two-thirds would be 96, as I got 13 the figure. 14 THE CHAIRMAN: Of what? 15 DR. BARD: Of 142, the House and three-fifths 16 would be 87, a difference of seven votes. In the Senate, 17 it would be 27 under the three-fifths rule, and 30 under 18 the two-thirds rule. 19 THE CHAIRMAN: Of course, this means, and to 20 use your illustration, 96 votes of those present would 21
