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would be a part of the one-third that you are not counting. I am not expressing that very well.

DR. BARD: It would work the other way, too.

THE CHAIRMAN: It could be much more than twothirds of those present is what I am suggesting.

Mr. Miller?

MR. MILLER: Mr. Chairman, in the Federal level in the Congress of the United States, a number of Members fluctuate, of course, because of the larger membership the more vacancies there may be, and the rule is very simple. It is two-thirds of those present, and it requires a quorum, of course, but after that, two-thirds of a legal meeting of the House or Senate, the two-thirds rule is met.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment?

DR. BURDETTE: I am a little confused as to whether we are now talking about two-thirds of all Members serving or two-thirds of those present, presuming a quorum.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Bard says the recommendation of his Committee is two-thirds of the membership.

DR. BARD: I am not sure. I wanted to express
