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out, I think, unless Professor Burdettes Committee can come up with some comprehensive clause that would apply to all such situations and boards. I would doubt that.

MR. BROOKS: We recommended that to every Committee that anything specific of that kind that only applies once be put in a schedule that would accompany the constitution and would only apply to enactment of the constitution.

THE CHAIRMAN: Ready for the first question? I want to ask this because I am not sure-I understood your last comment, Dr. Bard. You did not mean, did you, that the only way that the situation covered by one could be covered would be by the constitutional convention? There would be nothing --

DR. BARD: Mr. Chairman, in this constitution of Kentucky, they had a schedule in the back. This would be one way of handling it.

THE CHAIRMAN: A know but if you wanted to avoid having the convention fix the compensation it could be left to the first Legislature even though they may
