
THE CHAIRMAN: I am not sure your statement, you are not happy with it, is it the principle or the language used?

MR. BOND: I think it goes to both, sir. I was present at that discussion on this Section, sir. I have no such recollection that the Committee was given the charge that the General Assembly shall by law protect the rights of witnesses.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let me state my recollections, that the Commission decided that there should be provision for the protection of records, papers, and rights of witnesses. I do not think the Commission decided that this should be by law passed by the General Assembly necessarily.

JUDGE ADKINS: Was there a clear decision that the power, that the power of subpoena would be included in this. I remember there was discussion. But was there a clear voted decision on that question, or is that still open for debate?
