If you restrict the State Legislature, you may keep down abuses of their power if this creeps in, but you may be

Now, this can become a very dangerous situation unless there is some restraint, and there is none here, this provision for protection really means nothing, because the protection that a man would need in producing records would be the protection of secrecy. You obviously can't produce secrecy in the halls of Annapolis.
