THE CHAIRMAN: You would have a new Legislature elected beginning in 1970.

DR. BARD: Two years is right.

THE CHAIRMAN: The second question I am putting to you now is a provision in the constitution that until there is a new Legislature elected the compensation of whose members could be fixed at anything by the Legislature, the compensation of the members of the Legislature would be the same as existing at the time of the constitution being adopted.

DR. BARD: Right.

MRS. BOTHE: In the schedule or the body?
THE CHAIRMAN: Makes no difference.

MR. MILLER: Wouldn't that be four years.

THE CHAIRMAN: You would be halfway. At the time the constitution was adopted you would be halfway in the term of the members. You would have a new Legislature two years thereafter.

MR. MARTINEAU: It would seem to me that would be an extremely bad provision for I would anticipate the first two years after the constitution is adopted
