If you can, you are doing something I can't do. It is a dangerous power and should be exercised with great restraint, such as requiring two-thirds vote of either House or both Houses.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Bond?

MR. BOND: I would like to ask Judge Adkins why he would allocate the word, treachery, to elected State officials and not to elected Federal officials. I think in order to properly legislate and ascertain information that we should strengthen the Committees of the Legislature, and I think you have the right of subpoena.

JUDGE ADKINS: I can't deal with the Federal Constitution. That is not before us.

MR. MINDEL: According to my notes, the last meeting, I used the language like the matter should be germane to something before the Legislature. I was not present at the Committee meeting, but my recollection is that we wanted to give the Legislature that power provided it had some matters before it, and if this investigation or the books and records were necessary to determine this matter, then we wanted to give them that power. We were
